On With the Show

Texas native Lindsay Pumpa, a Miami-based interior designer, can design on a dime and deliver in short order. That's because she has a secret weapon. And recently, she was tagged by the HGTV network to create high-rise excitement for its new Urban Oasis Giveaway.

In 2008, Pumpa joined Tui Lifestyle, a design firm that creates fully decorated, furnished packages of contemporary furniture by designer Tui Pranich. The concept has been quite popular among high-rise homebuyers in some of South Florida's coolest new buildings, including Trump

Towers. But, it's not all about product; it's also about talent. Pumpa, with a Bachelor of Science degree in interior design from Florida State University and an active member of the American Society of Interior Designers, has helped propel the company to new heights in the U.S. and beyond. In her role as lead designer at Tui Lifestyle, Pumpa's responsibilities include overseeing the creation and execution of the brand's numerous collections, which include furnishings for the home, home office and outdoor areas.

Earlier this year, she was chosen to design the 2012 HGTV's third annual Urban Oasis Giveaway, which offers one lucky winner a chic-custom-designed city dwelling. This year's dream residence is located in Miami. Fully furnished, the two-bedroom, two-and-half bath, 1,700-square-foot residence at Paramount Bay is valued at \$900,000. Here, Pumpa put an aquatic spin on Miami's urban-chic lifestyle, showcasing cool stainless, soft aqua and natural browns in the décor of the 20th floor residence.

"The Sherwin-Williams color palette's neutral nuances spoke to me," Pumpa says. "The aquas, golds, grays and pops of color were drawn from views of the city and water."

The design incorporates exceptional views of Miami Beach, Biscayne Bay and the Port of Miami and plays with balance between refined modern furniture styling with reflective chrome metals, and antiqued wood finishes that emulate driftwood and smooth glass accents. While touring the residence, Pumpa was excited about every detail and explained the contribution of every item to the overall design theme. In keeping with the open floor-to-ceiling water views, she designed a floor-to-ceiling glass shower wall that provides a magnificent view through the master bedroom.

Prior to joining Pranich, Pumpa worked with the Mandarin Oriental Hotel Las Vegas. She considers that one of her greatest professional accomplishments ... at least until now. □
